The reunion will actually be an 11th - 15th year occasion because of the multiple classes.

Third, we have to determine a time and place for it. Fourth, before and after the reunion, we should keep up with each other by means of a regular newsletter. And fifth, financial support.

The enclosed list has the latest information that we were able to get from both old and new records. But there are a lot of blanks that need to be filled in. Some of the names don't have a known address. Some of those with addresses may not be the latest and correct addresses. Some of the girls have gotten married, and we need to know their married names. Any of you who are married, we want to know the name of your spouse. We need your help to fill in these blanks, so get out your address books and fill in our blanks for us.

We have a tentative time and place for the reunion, but we want your ideas also. We are aiming for the late summer/early fall of 1980. The place - in or around Minneapolis, Minnesota. However, there are some questions that will need answers to them. One, Where would you like to have the reunion? Two, How far are you willing to travel in order to attend the reunion? Answers to these questions could change the location of the reunion.

Earlier in this decade, my brother and sister attempted to keep an SIM newsletter going in much the same way that we want to do now. It lasted about 2 years before the lack of interest caused it to fold.

In order to make this new effort work, we need funds. We don't want to eliminate anyone, however, for the reunion only, we do feel that we must draw the limit at the classes mentioned. The only reason being the sheer number of people in those classes and the fact that this is our first attempt at organizing a reunion. In time, we do want to expand and try to get everyone together. Wouldn't it be something if everyone who ever attended K.A. (or even 75%) could get together at one time in one place.

I haven't mentioned it yet, but I would also like to include in the reunion any of the staff that were at K.A. Some of them I have addresses for, but there are a lot of others whom I can't even remember, so I hope that you can help out in that part also.

At the bottom of this letter is a simple form that we would like you to fill in and send back to us. Please take the time necessary to help us all.

So that's all, folks. It's now up to you. Ruth, Stephen and I are willing to do the work, but you have to supply that which will make it work. Write in letters, include a little or alot about what you've been up to since you left K.A., what your plans and goals in life are and anything that you might want to share with everyone else. We'll get it printed and sent out to you in another newsletter that we will try to get out in October or November.
