Dear Friends,

Once again it's press time and have we got news for you! As you can see by the impromptu letterhead, we finally have a name for ourselves, and from here on in, I will be referencing the newsletter by name. This balance sheet does not reflect the costs of this present issue which is even more than the last issue. As you can see, each issue gets more expensive than the previous issue. That is due to the ever increasing size of the mailing list. Please pray that all the financial needs will soon be met.

Let me remind you at this time that dues for the '80-'81 fiscal year are past due as of June 1. The lack of treasury input for dues since the conception of SIM Roots requires that dues for the '80-'81 year be \$5.00 per MK.

Just for a little statistics, over the period of June 1, 1979 to May 31, 1980, there were only 124 persons who paid their dues. That is only 12% of the present mailing list. Of those 124, there were 45 persons who contributed extra to help the treasury deficit. When I look at these figures, I cannot help but wonder if there is enough interest in SIM Roots to keep it going. IF you want to see SIM Roots continue, please send back the name and address correction form along with your dues for this year. If you should send more than just one years dues, please be sure to specify if it is for additional years dues or not. All unspecified monies above the \$5.00 dues will be considered a contribution to the treasury and will be thankfully received. To those 124 persons who paid dues and/or a contribution over the past year, we sincerely thank you.
